## DISTINCTIVE PROGRAMS

**Business Scholars Program** — 100 percent of Business Scholars are taught by corporate-born faculty and graduate with a project-based internship, extensive business skills training and experience in consulting in the development of local businesses.

**Teacher Certification** — Prospective teachers at Hanover gain experience in area classrooms in their first year and graduate with both a specialty degree and a teaching certificate.

**Sciences** — Hanover is the only institution in the state of Indiana whose pre-health science students have hands-on access to a human patient simulator and human cadaver dissection as undergraduates.

**Rivers Institute** — The Rivers Institute at Hanover College uses river environments to educate students and the general public about environmental issues through the natural and social sciences, the arts, and the humanities with programs like River Camp for Kids, Summer High School Academy, School Field Trip Program, Great River Paint Out, The Teacher Academy and more.

Hanover also offers domestic internship opportunities in Philadelphia, Chicago and Washington D.C.

## HANOVER ACCREDITATIONS

Hanover is accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

Hanover's Teacher Certification Program is accredited by the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education and the Indiana Professional Standards Board.

## STUDENT SUCCESS

Hanover graduates have achieved a 50 percent acceptance rate (of those who apply) in the prestigious Fulbright Scholarship Program.

At least 97 percent of our students are either employed or in grad school within seven months of graduation.

Hanover leads all Indiana colleges in the percentage of students who go straight into graduate school (32%).

## NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- The Princeton Review named us one of the nation's best institutions for undergraduate education — only 15 percent of four-year colleges in the U.S. and two Canadian colleges earned for this distinction.

## PANTHER ATHLETICS

The Horner Center, a 107,000 square-foot athletic facility, is the home of Panther Athletics. As a NCAA Division III program, Hanover competes in the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference (HCAC) comprised of nine schools from three states. One third of the student body competes in at least one of the following sports:

Baseball (M), Basketball (M/W), Cross Country (M/W), Football (M), Golf (M/W), Lacrosse (M), Soccer (M/W), Softball (W), Tennis (M/W), Track and Field (M/W), Volleyball (W).

## OUR COMMUNITY

Hanover is situated just west of historic Madison, Indiana. Once a major river port for the state, Madison (population 12,000) has maintained its sense of 19th century heritage with 133 city blocks on the National Register of Historic Places, designating it as the state's largest historic district. Midwest Living Magazine recently listed Madison as the 4th best small town to visit.
