

State Based Awards and Scholarships

Academic Honors Diploma Scholarship – A grant program committed to meeting **100% of Indiana student's demonstrated need**. This grant will go to **Indiana students** who graduate with an Academic Honors Diploma (AHD), have completed their application for admission by January 15, and file a complete and valid FAFSA by March 10.

Buckeye Scholarship – For 2008-2009, this award will be in the amount of \$3,000 per year. The Ohio Choice Grant is an important part of funding a college education for many **Ohio students**. Hanover College's Buckeye Scholarship is to reassure students that they can attend college outside of Ohio without sacrificing this valuable award. It is renewable each year provided a minimum cumulative 2.0 GPA is maintained.

Keys Scholarship – For 2008-2009, this award will be in the amount of \$3,000 per year. For many **Kentucky students**, the KEES Scholarship is an important part of funding a college education. Hanover College's Keys Scholarship is to reassure students that they can attend college outside of Kentucky without sacrificing this valuable award. It is renewable each year provided a minimum cumulative 2.0 GPA is maintained.

Travel Grant

A college visit is a crucial part of your college search. High school seniors (Class of 2008) who do an official admission visit between September 1, 2007 and May 1, 2008 will receive a one-time \$500 Hanover College Travel Grant as part their first year financial assistance package.

Academic Merit Scholarships

Academic Merit Scholarships serve to recognize the overall academic achievement of students. The scholarship review committee examines GPA, SAT/ACT scores, class rank, course load and academic rigor for all applicants to Hanover College. Awarding of the four categories of academic merit scholarships is largely based on the academic composite, but co-curricular activities and campus visit interactions can aid in difficult decisions. The amount and number of scholarships awarded in each category is determined on an annual basis according to the demographics of our applicant pool.

Parker Academic Merit Scholarship – Awarded in honor of Dr. Albert G. & Katharine Parker, Hanover's president and first lady from 1929-1958. Hanover College flourished under their care and guidance in the face of the great burdens of the times.

Hendricks Academic Merit Scholarship – Awarded in honor of Thomas A. Hendricks, a graduate of the class of 1841 who went on to serve as Vice President of the United States.

Blythe Academic Merit Scholarship – Awarded in honor of Dr. James Blythe, the first President of Hanover College. He led Hanover through its formative years and laid the groundwork for the outstanding institution it has become.

Donner Academic Merit Scholarship – Awarded in honor of William H. Donner, a Hanover alumnus who was a successful businessman in the tin plate and steel industries, and a philanthropist in cancer research.

Presidential Scholars Program Awards

The Presidential Scholars Program is a prestigious, competitive scholarship program. Each year top applicants are invited to campus for an opportunity to earn scholarships up to \$25,000 per year through an interview and essay competition. The Presidential Scholar Awards are:

Lilly Trustee Presidential Scholars Award – \$100,000 (\$25,000 per year x 4 years), Awarded through the Presidential Scholars program to students that demonstrated superior academic achievement and dedication to service throughout their high school career.

Horner Presidential Scholars Award – \$80,000 (\$20,000 per year x 4 years), Awarded through the Presidential Scholars program to students that possess quality and strength of character and have demonstrated superior academic achievement. Hanover created this scholarship in honor of Dr. John Horner, the thirteenth president of Hanover College whose leadership was invaluable during the aftermath of the 1974 tornado that devastated campus.

Crowe-Long Presidential Scholars Award – \$64,000 (\$16,000 per year x 4 years), Awarded through the Presidential Scholars program to dedicated students who are active members in their community, much like our annually recognized outstanding senior Crowe Citation and Long Citation award winners. Hanover created this scholarship in honor of John Finley Crowe, founder of Hanover College, and Henry Long, a champion of women's education in Indiana.

Music majors and non-majors are eligible for the scholarships in the amount of \$2,500 - \$3,500. Auditions are held during annual Music Scholarship Audition days. Audition requirements can be found in the Music Scholarship Brochure. Scholarships are renewable each year at the discretion of the music faculty, based on accomplishment and end-of-year evaluation.

Theatre Scholarships are available through the Hanover College Theatre Department. Scholarships, in the amount of \$2,500 - \$3,500, are available to all new Hanover College students who intend to participate in any area of theatre, regardless of major. Requirements for consideration include a 20 minute appointment with a theatre faculty member during the annual Theatre Audition days. Interview/Audition Portfolio requirements can be found in the Theatre Scholarship Brochure. Scholarships are renewable each year based on theatre participation and faculty recommendation.
