Molly Jones is in her 12th season as Hanover's head coach. She has racked up more than 250 career victories, including a 131-125 record on the Panthers' bench.

Jones led Hanover to a winning record in her first season with the Panthers (13-12), following that effort with back-to-back 17-victory campaigns. The 17-win seasons each matched the school's single-season record for wins.

She guided Hanover to back-to-back winning seasons in 2004-05 and 2005-06, with the squads combining for 31 wins. Jones has coached 16 all-conference selections at Hanover. Among that group are nine of the top career scorers in school history. Jones tallied a 134-121 record in 11 seasons as head coach at Marian College in Indianapolis, Ind., before returning to her alma mater in 1998.

CAMP FEATURES

Eligibility

For girls entering grades 3 through 10 in fall of 2010. Girls will be grouped according to age and ability.

Facilities

All basketball activities will take place in the Horner Health and Recreation Center. The Horner Center is an air-conditioned facility with 5 full courts.

Housing

Campers will be housed in a dormitory on campus within a short walking distance to the gym and cafeteria. There will be two campers assigned to each room and campers can request their roommate by filling out each other's names on the application form. Special requests can be made to add a third roommate. Camp counselors will monitor the dorms throughout the night and at all times campers are present in the dorms.

Meals

Meals will be served in the Brown Campus Center. A concession stand will be available at the gym at various times throughout the day. Water coolers will be set up and available at all times.

Medical needs

A camp trainer will be on duty throughout each basketball session. All medication must be checked in with the trainer at camp check-in.

Camp Cost

The cost for the camp is \$295.00 and includes room and board, individual, group and team instruction, guest speakers, a camp t-shirt, a ball, and an evaluation. Campers will have the option to attend as a day camper at a reduced price of \$250.00 which includes all meals.
